How does it work?

Our range of IOSH courses by virtual classroom learning have been designed for managers, supervisors and workers in any sector or organisation, anywhere in the world.

Delegates participate in an introductory virtual classroom tutorial, undertaken via Microsoft Teams, where the key principles of the course will be discussed. The introductory webinar introduces the learners to their tutor, and each other, just as a classroom training session would.

Learners then complete the online course and resources via our award-winning online learning platform. Online study duration varies depending on the course.



The webinars:

- Outline the overall aims and objectives of the course.
- Outline the role that IOSH training plays in improving the understanding of health and safety in the workplace.
- Outline the key elements of the course.
- Provide an opportunity for delegates to discuss the specific context in which they are operating, and to review health and safety issues that are relevant to their organisation and their roles within it.
- Show delegates how to access online course resources.
- Outline how delegates can make the best use of their time when completing online course resources.
- Give some pointers as to how best to complete the end assessment/assignment, depending on which course they are undertaking. (Please note: these are an integral part of the course and a requirement of IOSH.)
- Webinar duration is generally up to three hours per day, depending on the course.
